










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Digital Alphabetization Projects (Reducing the Digital Gap)




"Mayores con Iniciativa", spread the benefits of Information Technology and Communication among people over 50 years and develops in these people the capabilities and skills to integrate them into their daily lives, actively participating in the Information Society. This is done using a methodology of work, through the Information Technology and Communication (ICT), based on the implementation of creative initiatives that capture the interest of older people (such as recovery of historical memory of a municipality), so learning to use new tools without realizing it while you entertain, have fun and relates to others.

Also, to encourage participation and increase the visibility of the initiatives, the project envisages the holding of a national competition designed to recognize the efforts of the social agents that drive them and the willingness of older people who participate in them.

Lines of action.


- Development of a Web 2.0 technology, enabling a collaborative environment for sharing resources, supporting the members who composed.





