The Committee of the Regions, S3 platform and the Helsinki-Uusimaa, Province of Utrecht and Valencia regions organise this one-day Bench-Learning conference to examine concrete possibilities for European partnerships and offer an interactive participatory platform for regions and cities to explore relevant collaboration methodologies and important thematic issues.

The focus is on both regional and city collaboration. Short presentations and relevant examples will serve as a starting point for practical and creative conversations about activities already in progress, innovative methodologies in use and concrete further steps for developing partnerships.

The working methods are interactive and will include the facilitated use of the Meshmoon online virtual reality worlds before, during and after the conference.

Why is this conference special?

This is a conference about integrating content with creating partnerships, and it is **not** like others you may have attended before.

This conference is organized to stimulate conversations and create partnerships. It brings together people from cities and regions concerned with exploring practical suggestions for implementing their RIS3 programmes and finding serious partners to work with their initiatives.

- **"Bench-learning":** International experts and practitioners will present recent and relevant insights from work-in-progress to inspire discussions. Participants will be encouraged to share their own experiences and examples, discover common interests and explore plans to work together. The majority of conference time during the parallel sessions is devoted to this.
- "Purposeful conversations": The conference is designed to be highly interactive, and facilitators will be available both in the parallel sessions and during the networking lunch to help people participate fully, bringing together people with similar interests, experience and requirements.
- **"Working with virtual worlds":** In addition to this, the innovative Virtual Worlds provided by Meshmoon will support people in working together before, during and after the conference. So the conversations can continue in an on-line space for facilitating collaboration and partnerships.

This conference is part of an on-going initiative, carrying on from work begun at the Committee of the Regions' "Innovation Union" conference last year (on the 27th November); and there will be follow-through sessions later in 2014.

This event is part of a process to stimulate conversations between people, and the people who come are central to its success. We look forward to your active participation.

Matchmaking with current and potential partners continues

Introduction

Between 2014 and 2020 "smart specialisation strategies" (RIS3) will be a priority for every region within the European Structural and Investment Funds, as well as the Horizon 2020 programme and other initiatives. But what does this mean in terms of creating concrete partnerships and realising successful collaborative partnering arrangements?

This conference brings together people from across Europe so that they can learn from each other and engage in facilitated conversations about creating the next generation of partnerships and projects which could be used to translate smart specialisation strategies into practice.

The focus is on both regional and city collaboration. Specific examples of pioneering smart regional developments from Helsinki, Valencia and many other regions will serve as a starting point for practical and creative conversations about activities already in progress, innovative methodologies currently in use and concrete further steps for European partnerships.

Objectives

- Developing a clear understanding of what smart specialisation partnerships really mean: exploring concrete proposals for joint projects.
- Exchanging experience with and examples of relevant methodologies and existing activities, and learning together from this experience.
- Creating concrete platforms for potential partners to explore relevant ideas and make initial partner agreements.

Results

- The participating regions will start and/or deepen cooperation initiatives on the topics they jointly create and define (expanding, where relevant, on work completed before the conference). The target of these joint initiatives is to implement the Europe 2020 strategy according to the interests of the participating regions.
- The conference proceedings will be published by the CoR, describing the lessons learned and ways forward, as well as information about how to implement joint platforms for interregional collaboration and partnerships in practice.
